Les trois accords en position fondamentale

Exercise 1: Fundamental positions of Do, Fa, and Sol chords. The notation shows five measures on a grand staff. The first measure is Do (C4), the second is Fa (F4), and the third is Sol (G4). The fourth measure is Fa (F4) and the fifth is Do (C4). Fingerings are indicated: for Do, right hand (RH) 5-3-1 and left hand (LH) 1-3-5; for Fa, RH 2-4-2 and LH 3-2-5; for Sol, RH 2-4-2 and LH 3-2-5.

Les trois accords en premier renversement

Exercise 2: First inversions of Do, Fa, and Sol chords. The notation shows five measures on a grand staff. The first measure is Do (C4), the second is Fa (F4), and the third is Sol (G4). Les trois accords en deuxième renversement

Exercise 3: Second inversions of Do, Fa, and Sol chords. The notation shows five measures on a grand staff. The first measure is Do (C4), the second is Fa (F4), and the third is Sol (G4). Un accord, trois positions. Répétez ensuite sur les autres accords.

Exercise 4: Repeating a chord in three positions. The notation shows seven measures on a grand staff. The first measure is Do (C4) in fundamental position. The second and third measures are Fa (F4) in first and second inversions, respectively. The fourth measure is Sol (G4) in fundamental position. The fifth and sixth measures are Fa (F4) in second and first inversions, respectively. The seventh measure is Do (C4) in fundamental position.
